Covid-19 testing	Passengers aged 5 years and older must hold a negative Covid-19 test result obtained prior to departure.	72 hours prior to ARRIVAL into Vietnam RT-PCR for any passenger over 2 years of age.
	 Covid-19 test result obtained prior to departure. Accepted tests are; Nucleic acid amplification (NAA) tests, such as a polymerase chain reaction (PCR, RT-PCR) test, transcription mediated amplification, or Loopmediated isothermal amplification. These tests must be obtained within 3 days prior to departure; or Rapid antigen tests (RAT). RATs must be obtained within 24 hours prior to departure and come from certified laboratory – self test kits results not acceptable. The test result must also include the following information in English, or in original language along with a certified translation to English: Passengers' name and date of birth (age at time of test or passport number accepted, if date of 	· ·
	 birth not listed); The test result (such as 'negative' or 'not detected'); The method of test conducted (e.g. PCR test); and The date and time the respiratory sample was collected. 	



Additional information may be requested:

- 1. The respiratory sample type that was collected (e.g. nasopharyngeal);
- 2. The date and time the test result was authorised and the name of the laboratory authorising officer:
- 3. Name and address of the laboratory, clinic or facility that administered the test; and
- 4. Accreditation body that the laboratory is affiliated with.

Some states have additional requirements see extra's below.



Insurance	Not required.	Proof of Health coverage by sponsoring company or Insurance coverage for estimated quarantine upon arrival if testing positive during arrival isolation period or during hotel quarantine period. We are suggesting 14-28 day coverage plan. Minimum value is currently USD\$20,000 and specifically mention coverage for Covid-19. We suggest a \$50,000 coverage in keeping with other regional countries requirements.
Quarantine	Unvaccinated passengers: Passengers aged 12 years and older who do not hold proof that they are fully vaccinated against Covid-19 must quarantine for 14 days on arrival.	Unvaccinated passengers: Passengers aged 12 years and older who do not hold proof that they are fully vaccinated against Covid-19 must quarantine for 7 days on arrival in approved hotels. Children may quarantine at home with vaccinated parents.
	Vaccinated passengers: Passengers may be eligible for reduced quarantine or no quarantine as per state specific guidelines, provided they hold proof that they are fully vaccinated against Covid-19 with an Australian government recognised vaccine.	Vaccinated passengers: 3-day home/hotel isolation with test done on day 1&3 and results presented to local health authority
	NSW: Unvaccinated 7 days at Hotel/Vaccinated 7 days Home VIC: Unvaccinated 7 days at Hotel/Vaccinated 7 days Home QLD: Unvaccinated 14-28 days at Hotel/Vaccinated 7 days Home isolation - You must have evidence of your vaccination - such as a COVID-19 digital certificate, an immunisation history statement (printed or digital) or an international COVID-19 vaccination certificate. WA: Unvaccinated 14 days at Hotel/Vaccinated 7 days Home - use the G2G Now (external link) app and be subject to in-person checks by WA Police as required while in self-quarantine. Vaccination	 Travellers must be fully vaccinated (Australian Citizens/PR/Visa 100,101,102,309,445,801,820 are exempt) with approved Vaccinations (mixed doses are acceptable): Comirnaty (Pfizer) Vaxzevria (AstraZeneca) Spikevax or Takeda (Moderna) COVID-19 Vaccine Janssen (Janssen) Nuvaxovid (Biocelect on behalf of Novavax) Coronavac (Sinovac) Covishield (AstraZeneca - Serum Institute of India) Covaxin (Bharat Biotech) BBIBP-CorV for people under 60 years of age on arrival in Australia (Sinopharm China) Sputnik V (Gamaleya Research Institute) Victoria: Evidence of vaccination for overseas travellers is: An Australian International COVID-19 Vaccination Certificate or A paper or digital certificate, which is in English or accompanied by a certified translation and is issued by an overseas government authority or 	Vaccinations acceptable for entry to Australia are recognised as acceptable for entry to Vietnam. Vaccination certificates must be in English and or Vietnamese.

Entry Paperwork	Valid Australia Passport or Other passport with valid Visa issued by Australian government where passport expire date is showing at least 6 months validity.	Passengers not holding onward/return tickets or other acceptable evidence of onward/return travel <u>may</u> be refused entry. This applies to Visa holders and is at discretion of airline check-in staff/immigration officers.
Extra's	Passengers must submit an Australia Travel Declaration at least 72 hours prior to departure and show a printed or digital copy prior to boarding. Parents should complete a declaration for any child aged younger than 15 years. NSW: You must take a rapid antigen test within 24 hours of your arrival in NSW and again on day 6 of isolation	Passengers must hold a completed health declaration form on arrival. The form may be completed in hard copy or electronically. http://tokhaiyte.vn



QLD: Unvaccinated may only enter via Brisbane Airport and are subject to 14 day quarantine or 28 days if they refuse to be tested

VIC: Passengers must complete the <u>Victorian Quarantine</u> <u>Arrival Form</u> prior to departure.

All States:

Unvaccinated passengers: Passengers aged 12 years and older who do not hold proof that they are fully vaccinated against Covid-19 are not permitted to depart from Australia.

Vaccinated passengers: Australian nationals and residents are permitted to exit Australia provided they hold proof that they have received two doses of an Australian government recognised vaccine against Covid-19. They must present their International Covid-19 Vaccination Certificate prior to boarding.
